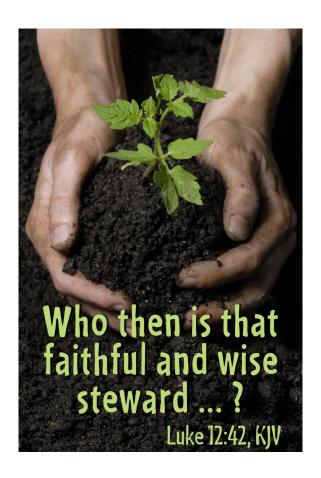


Annual Report 2014

Youth Pastor Report

As I reflect on the ministry that took place in 2014, I am reminded of Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." In 2014 we as a church had the opportunity as God's workmanship to do good works for Him, to give Him glory, and I am thankful to say that more often than not we took advantage of those opportunities to do good works, and give glory to God. In this report I want to look at areas where I can see God working in order to give Him praise.

At the start of 2014 a team was already formed to go to Costa Rica on a short term mission trip in July. For some members of the team this was their third mission trip to Costa Rica since 2009. For others it was their first time, but either way, it was clear that God had great things plans for this team. In the months leading up to the trip our team met regularly. During these times, we focused on team building, prayer, trip preparation, and together we read the book "Love Does" by Bob Goff. During our time in Costa Rica the team lived with host families, shared a lot of laughs and worked together to share the good news of Jesus Christ with everyone we worked with. Two of the ministry highlights from the trip were ministering to three of the local high schools by giving a cross culture presentation and our students shared their testimonies and what Jesus means in their lives. During our time at the schools, we had the opportunity to invite the kids we were working with to the local church for a movie night. The movie that was shown was filmed in Rochester and it is called "King's Faith". The movie hit on some topics, such as gangs, broken families and drug use that the high schoolers in Costa Rica could relate to. Another one of the ministry highlights from the trip was the time we spent at a sports and Bible camp located in a community of refugees living in extreme poverty. We were able to be part of the soccer camps that meet there on Saturday mornings. We helped lead Bible studies and shared some testimonies with the people at the camp. We also helped fix up the facility during the week, by picking up trash, organizing a tool shed, painting and other various maintenance activities. While a lot of great ministry took place during this 11-day trip, two clear highlights stand out to me. The first is the relationships that were formed. Relationships between team members and between our team and the Costa Rican's that we worked with. The second highlight came during our time of debriefing before we returned back to the states. Two of our students had asked to be baptized during the trip. After a week of ministry it was a great way to conclude the trip. One of the ways this trip was made great was by the leaders that attended the trip: I am thankful to Mary Haltiner, Jeff Hoyt, Delaney Seaman, Tiffany Walter, and of course, our missionary Carlos Mestayer who has been facilitating the groups we have taken down since 2009.

While the youth group mission trip to Costa Rica was the major activity that we did this summer, it was not the only ministry that took place. As we typically do, our church participated in Flower City Work Camp. The students and adult leaders that participated were a blessing to the city of Rochester. Not only were they a blessing, but many of them grew in their personal walk with the Lord. In addition to these two major events the youth ministry at PCC has kept busy in 2014 with our weekly Sunday night meetings. We looked at a few different topics this year. During the spring we had an intense study of what the Gospel is. Two of our students lead the teaching time during the study and did a wonderful job with it. This past fall we spent most of our time studying the Sermon on the Mount.

The youth ministry was not the only PCC related ministry that was keeping me busy this past year. In 2013 our church started a ministry called <u>Thrive</u>. Thrive is children's church for grades 1-5, which Tiffany and I lead every Sunday except for the first Sunday of the month, when the children attend worship with their parents. This ministry has been great for the life of our church, and Tiffany and I have enjoyed leading it each week. Over this past year the ministry has grown and we have incorporated a third person to help us each week. I am thankful to Shannon Magin, Kate Hartsough and Chrissy McMillan for helping out once a month.

One area of ministry that has been a huge blessing to me this past year is the college aged Bible study that was started. A group of PCC students that stayed in the Rochester area for college have been meeting monthly for a Bible Study that Tiffany and I lead. This has been a great way for these students to continue to maintain the relationships that they started while at PCC, to have accountability in their Christian walk and to study the Word with a group of people that they have a history with. I am looking forward to continuing this new Bible Study in 2015.

Worship Pastor Report

2014 was an exciting year for me as Worship Pastor. I was and am still very grateful for PCC's increasing my hours to full time. It has been wonderful being able to fully pursue some of my goals as well as to work toward new ones. While I will give an overview of the highlights from 2014, I wish to say that the worship of PCC is still my highest priority. I will continue to strive for authentic true worship by choosing music that is biblically based reflecting spiritual truth. I will also continue to encourage members to feel a freedom to worship by responding naturally to all that Jesus is and all that He has done.

This year we began a drama team. The drama team is responsible for acting, writing and directing biblical dramas for the church service. This year we were able to write and perform three times. It is and will not be a regular occurrence as it is difficult to get enough people together in a short time frame but I will continue to look for opportunities to do so.

When Easter is included the choir sang nine times during the spring. We did a combination of a cappella, gospel, southern gospel, traditional and contemporary. With such a diverse congregation, I will continue to seek balance in our selection and include a variety of styles.

Summer saw the TV screen go up in the Fellowship Hall which has been a blessing to most of us and has been used consistently. This was the final piece of a magnification project that included new speakers, electric drums and a new sound board. I feel these improvements have been an enormous success thanks to the large amount of positive feedback I have received from the congregation.

Fall saw the choir singing all new material but that ceased at Thanksgiving when we seriously began working on a larger project, "The Gospel According To Scrooge".

The "Gospel According to Scrooge" musical that took place in December was also, I believe, a success on two levels. First, we had close to 600 people attend the two performances. Many were not regular attendees. That meant that many people who we do not know where they are spiritually saw the Gospel in a fun, exciting and non-threatening way. We continue to pursue connections with these people and have them on a list to encourage them to come to other special events.

Second, the show was wonderful at bringing people together. Friendships were formed in the body that had not existed before. The show unified PCC with the time commitment, so many of us working toward the same goal. Also it encouraged the entire church family to be active together in evangelizing others by inviting them to the production.

I have always felt a strong conviction for these sorts of projects because I have seen churches rally together, coming closer to one another, but also being encouraged by one another as each one proclaims the Gospel.

Finally, I wish to thank James and Amy Bulmahn for their service as deacons of Magnification. James was instrumental in all of the audio upgrades including setting the screen we enjoy in the Fellowship Hall. Amy worked tirelessly with a team including Diane Alderman to repaint and refurbish much of the downstairs and the office hallway.

At the end of the summer James and Amy felt they were ready for a break. In the interim as we discuss our entire deacon situation I have been coordinating Magnification with the help of Wally Forstrom our Elder for Deacons. I am pleased to say that many of the things that fall under Magnification have been working well. I have sought out the needs of the individuals that fall under this "M" and they are in good shape.

When I look back at 2014 I see a year of progress, improvements, effective ministries, and an overall desire to be intentional about making decisions when empowered and directed by the Holy Spirit. As such, I continue to be thankful to be a pastor and member of Perinton Community Church.

Elder Team Report

Trust in the LORD with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek His will in all you do, and He will show you which path to take. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

To give a quick overview of 2014, the Elders met together 9 times for regularly monthly scheduled meetings, held 2 non-scheduled meetings, came together for an elder planning retreat, organized our annual PCC Leaders retreat, and interviewed and welcomed 8 persons into the fellowship of PCC as members.

Our Elders Retreat was held January 24-25 (the first one ever). It was a time to regroup, encourage one another, reflect on the past year, and to discuss plans/visions for PCC. During our discussions we were reminded to embrace our role as spiritual leaders allowing God to work through us with the gifts and passions that He has gifted us with. As elders our leadership responsibilities encompass both the spiritual as well as the administrative aspects of PCC. This certainly has its challenges and, by the grace of God, we endeavor to maintain a strong and caring leadership. Our retreat discussions also focused on the growth in Sunday morning's attendance as we gradually approach the capacity of our sanctuary.

It has been about 14 years since PCC has moved away from the "Church Officers" structure of leadership to our current model consisting of Elders and Deacons. Based upon this model, each Deacon is assigned a specific task related to PCC's 5 stated values namely Magnification, Membership, Maturity, Ministry and Mission. Over time some of the areas of ministry have changed enough so that a Deacon position might have become somewhat obsolete. Because of these changes the elders will be evaluating our current structure during 2015.

PCC is blessed to have an abundance of children and a number of programs ministering to them. It is a requirement for all those involved with our children's programs to go through a training class on PCC's Child Protection & Policy. Because of this a class was held on February 8th with 83 attending.

One topic that has come across all areas of PCC's leadership has been the issue of open Wi-Fi connection for those in attendance at our services. The office staff have been the only ones with access to the Wi-Fi with some allowance for special requests. In order to expand this, concerns over security and abuse were the elders focus of discussion. When those issues were resolved the trustees were asked to proceeded with the process of having it installed.

Over the last several years DL has been working, on a part-time basis, towards a Masters degree in Theology from Northwestern Seminary at Roberts Wesleyan College. Having completed his work this year, we have put in motion the process of ordination to include an ordination council that Pastor Tim will be organizing. We look forward to that occasion.

Trustee Board Report

As the Summary of Income and Expenses for 2014 shows, we had a very good financial year. Our giving was wonderfully increased and we stayed under our budget for total expenses. An oversight in 2013 did not allow enough allocation by the Mission Team for supporting the Costa Rica Trip but the shortfall was easily covered and all went well.

As a group entrusted with overseeing our funds and the care of the building, we tried to do more than just authorize spending and fixing things as the needs arose. Unfortunately, that is an ideal and there were emergency repairs and expenses that just had to be taken care of (i.e., rodent sites, bee invasions, tree hit by lightning, chairs falling apart, lighting ballast, tree removal by the office, and some other necessary items). We have an aging building and this year we hope to address that issue in a major way. Since we do have a surplus from the 2014 budget, we want to look at some upgrading and improvements that can be handled before they become emergencies. There is still a problem with the tile flooring in the main entrance, brickwork is needed on the rear of the building, new lighting is necessary in some stairwell areas, updating and improving many of the bathroom areas, re-allocating some of the usable space, and careful inspection of the entire building to determine what parts are sound and functioning well and what areas may become problems and/or need updating in the next few years.

We will also be looking ahead to major needs such as a new roof and expanded paving in the next few years. To be sure these can be handled on an "as needed" basis, we will probably be asking the congregation to increase the amount of funds we can put in the Facility Escrow Fund. In "dreaming", the way we have often asked other committees to consider at budget preparation time, we are considering the opportunity to build an outdoor pavilion just beyond the parking lot (where the big willow tree stood). An Ad Hoc committee will be formed of members of all types of groups and interests within the church and we will keep the congregation informed.

As a congregation we have been greatly blessed and it is our task to continue to use these blessings to serve the Lord, the community and our programs as we grow and deepen our commitments.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE BRIGADE

Christian Service Brigade, commonly known as Boy's Brigade, is a ministry to boys from preschool to junior high age. The program provides a time of fun, practical activity, and Christian learning to inspire boys to grow into Christian young men, husbands, dads, and community leaders. This year Brigade operates as two groups, Tree Climbers and Stockade. The Tree Climbers group is for Kindergarten through second grade boys. This club program is structured for boys and their dads. The older group, for third through sixth grade boys, is called Stockade. About 20 boys are participating on Wednesday evenings along with 8 to 10 dads or leaders. This year Jon VerHow has joined us as co-coordinator as he prepares to take on the leadership of PCC's Brigade program.

The club meetings usually begin with games that include both of the age groups as well as dads and leaders. Typically, games start well before the scheduled meeting time and continue until most of the boys have arrived. Next, the entire group joins a formation for an opening prayer, the pledge of allegiance to the American flag, and announcements. We then break into Tree Climbers and Stockade groups for meetings that usually include Bible study or memory verses, a craft or learning activity, a story, and more active games.

Our Brigade also does a number of special activities throughout the year. These included a three night camping trip at Fourth Lake in the Adirondack Mountains, a winter weekend at Camp Hickory Hill, hikes and picnics, the Pinewood Derby, and attending a Rochester Red Wings baseball game and a Rochester Americans hockey game.

Throughout the year many men have helped with providing the program for the boys. They include Andy George, Chad Goodchild, Jeff Hoyt, Kevin Magin, Tim Nickson, Greg Peck, and Steve Smeenk. We will always welcome others to join in on an occasional or routine basis.

PIONEER GIRLS

We are well into our fifth year since restarting this ministry at Perinton Community Church after not offering it during the 2009/10-program year. This ministry has been a blessing to our girls, leaders, PCC and the community. In five years, we have more than tripled our enrollment. We currently have 33 girls attending Pioneer Girls on a regular basis; three are from other churches or currently have no home church. We are down 3 girls from last year. This year we continued with four groups: Scooters (4 and 5 years old), Voyagers (1st and 2nd graders), Pathfinders (3rd and 4th graders) and Trailblazers (5th, 6th and 7th graders). We have 6 Scooters, 13 Voyagers, 10 Pathfinders and 4 Trailblazers led by 6 leaders and 3 to 4 helpers.

We are working with the same curriculum as last year but in different books so our badges are not a repeat of last year. Most girls will spend 2 years in each group. So far we have been busy learning about God, creating friendships, strengthening our community and reaching out to those that may not have as much as we do. The girls have been learning about the Bible and God's desire to have a relationship with each one of them.

Together we have had Bible story meetings and theme days. There were service projects for church members; two of those were for members battling cancer. We also supported the PCC 'Love Box Ministry'. Our 2014 family events were the fall outing at Wickham Farms and the annual Christmas caroling. The Pinewood Derby is another event that makes many memories for both the girls and boys. What a wonderful tradition! In December, we did a Christmas focus, in January we invited families to eat dinner together and celebrate the girls' accomplishments. Our Pioneer Girl Sunday was in March. In that event the girls shone as they greeted church members prior to worship and sang during the offering. March will also be the Pinewood Derby and in April we will have our Annual Sleep Over. I know the girls are excited about the thought of spending the night at church. We will celebrate the end of the year with a second awards ceremony.

This ministry is changing lives. Praise God! What a blessing!

MISSION TEAM

Missions in 2014 was a year of great change, interest and action here at PCC.

We were encouraged once again by the number of people from our congregation that have felt called to the mission field. We have sent out servants in many locations and serving in many different areas.

Early in the year the missions team felt the need to refocus our efforts. We redefined our purpose as a team to:

- Provide financial, prayer, emotional and logistic support to the missionaries that we have selected to be directly involved with.
- To promote within the congregation interaction and interest with our missionaries.
- To challenge the congregation in regard to missions.
- To promote, develop and mentor those from our congregation that feel called to the mission field.

We also set a new goal for ourselves:

God's people at PCC will be impacted, invested, involved in missions for God's glory.

To achieve this goal we have increased our efforts to disseminate information. We don't want to limit exposure to just the missions we support in our budget so we continue to subscribe to "The Church Around The World", a flyer we insert into the bulletin and we are using the months that have a fifth Sunday in order to introduce a person or organization that we do not currently support in our budget.

We delivered, completed and distributed our Mission family booklet. It is our hope that this will be used to better familiarize ourselves with the missionaries and organizations that we support. This can also be used as a guide for prayer and encouragement. We feel it is extremely important that our mission family know that we are praying for them and interested in what is going on with them and their ministry.

I feel it is important to let you know what the 02 mission fund is and how it is used. This is a unique fund. It is not funded through our budget. All the money in this fund comes from donations that are specifically designated as missions. This fund is a very important part of our tool kit to support missions. Many things pop up in between budgets and this fund can be used by the mission team at their discretion to address such things. Over the years we have used this fund to cover many things but I'll use this year as an example. This year we used this fund to:

- Assist in travel expenses for visiting missionaries.
- Provide funding for Michelle Benedett. (Entered the field in between budget cycles)
- Assisted Rock of Hope Ministries and Iosif Ignataoie with budget shortfalls.
- Provided funding for Kari Forstrom to go with Young life on a mission trip to El Salvaror to provide medical services.

It is apparent the team does a lot. We are doing this with what I believe is the smallest team we've had in a very long time. Please pray that God will continue to energize us as well as bring forth others interested in serving on this team.

Financial activity during 2014 resulted in a net income of \$31,529 compared to a net income last year (2013) of \$68,502. Expenses were 3% below budget while income was 5% above budget. The 2015 budget of \$449,760 requires an average income of \$37,480 per month which is a 2% increase over our 2014 giving of \$36,851 per month.

Other items of note:

- Ingathering giving for The Hope Preschool Beirut was \$15,210.
- Expenses for the Christmas Play (Scrooge) was \$2,230.
- At the 11/10/14 congregational meeting, \$6,500 was approved to transfer from the Current Fund to three Escrow Funds for various projects.

A special thanks to Coralie Hoselton, Ed Marr, Crystal Nickson, and Al Soanes for their service as Assistant Treasurers this past year. Also, a thank you to Helen Matthews for mailing the Mission checks each month.

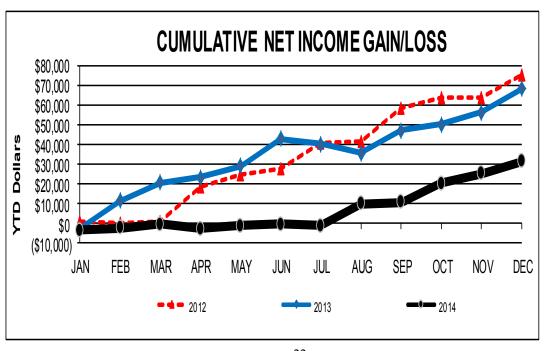
